



Parkour UK - Teacher's CPD Tutor

Parkour UK is at a pivotal point in its development and executive capacity has now been in place for 6 months to deliver a strategy which supports the community to thrive.

In relation to the 'Grow our community' outcome in our 'Move with Purpose' strategy we have developed new course material and content for our 1st 4 Sport Introductory Award in Teaching Parkour/Freerunning. This is a one-day course for school teachers to allow them to develop a parkour offering within their PE content.

With high demand for these courses, we would like to create a team of approx. six Teacher's CPD tutors based across the UK who can deliver this one-day course on a freelance basis to teachers.

Our tutors will have a region where they deliver in the UK and should be based in that area:

1. 'North' – Any delivery from North Yorkshire and upwards into Scotland.
2. 'Midlands & Wales' Any delivery across the midlands, Wales and as far south as Birmingham
3. 'South' Any delivery south of Birmingham, some of Wales, across London and the south coast of England.

Fees:

Course Delivery - £250 per day + travel & accommodation

Training, supervised delivery & development - £100 per day + travel & accommodation

Hours – Typical course delivery is 1 day from 8:45am - 5pm plus travel time.

Type – Freelance/Sub Contractor – as and when available.

Purpose of the Role

Reporting directly to the Development Manager, the successful candidates will lead the delivery of the 1st 4 Sport Introductory Award in Teaching Parkour/Freerunning in schools around the UK. Initially successful candidates will participate in a training day and supervised delivery before delivering independently.

The position is regionally based with travel across the region allocated to deliver courses.

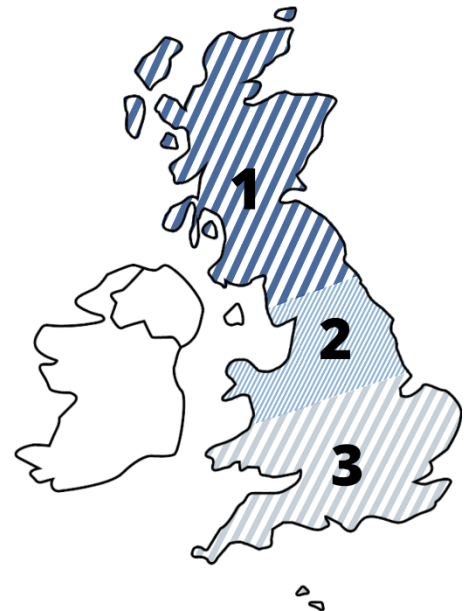
Closing date for applications: Midnight Sunday 18 April.

Qualifications

A Level 2 Qualification in Coaching Parkour/Freerunning or equivalent: First Aid; Safeguarding and Child Protection. Up to Date DBS/PVG checks or equivalent.

(Candidates with Level 1 Qualifications in Coaching Parkour/Freerunning may be considered if they can demonstrate relevant experience and agree to the completion of their Level 2 qualifications in the first 6 months of the role.)

Key Responsibilities

Training & Development

- Attend a training day to learn to deliver the course, followed by supervised deliveries
- Be occupationally competent in the area of delivery and identify own development needs throughout the training phase
- Develop working relationships with colleagues to support peer-to-peer learning

Course Delivery

- Deliver the 1st 4 Sport Introductory Award in Teaching Parkour/Freerunning for teachers in schools around the UK – independently and in a team.
- Feedback on the delivery of any training to their employer when appropriate to ensure content is fit for purpose (highlighting content that is well received or a challenge for learners to understand).
- Monitor learner progress and provide ongoing feedback throughout the programme.
- Ensure that all learners feel welcome, respected, and their physical and psychological wellbeing is equal and safe in all learning and development environments.
- Create a collaborative learning environment – where tutors and delegates can learn from each other.
- Ensure the culture and environment is designed to meet a learners’ welfare needs and allow them the opportunity to achieve their goals and meet their aspirations.
- Tailor the teaching, learning and development needs of the learner to ensure inclusive approach is adhered to.
- Ensure accurate completion of documentation.
- Understand, adapt and implement different teaching and learning methods.
